Professor John Hatchard is a Barrister and Professor of Law at the Buckingham Law School and Visiting Professor at the Open University. He is also a Senior Research Fellow at the School of Oriental and African Studies. He is Co-Director of the University of Buckingham Centre for Extractive Energy Studies.

He has held senior academic positions at universities in the United Kingdom, United States, Australia, Zambia and Zimbabwe. He has also served as Chief Mutual Legal Assistance Officer at the Commonwealth Secretariat and was a Senior Fellow at the British Institute for International and Comparative Law. Between 2000 and 2001 he was the Director of the University of Detroit-Mercy London Law Program.

He has undertaken consultancy work for a wide range of international organizations, particularly in the field of combating corruption, good governance and human rights.

He is the author of, amongst other books, *Comparative Constitutionalism and Good Governance in the Commonwealth* (with Muna Ndulo and Peter Slinn, 2005) and *Corruption and the Misuse of Public Office* (with Colin Nicholls, Tim Daniel and Alan Bacarese, 2006, 2nd edition 2011).

He is a member of the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Commonwealth Law and Legal Education* and serves on the Editorial Advisory Board of the *Denning Law Journal*. For many years he was Editor of *Commonwealth Legal Education*, Editor of the *Corruption Case Law Reporter* and Joint Editor of the *Journal of African Law*.
