Indra Overland is Research Professor and Head of the Centre for Energy Research at the Norwegian Institute of International Affairs (NUPI). He was previously Head of the Russia, Eurasia and Arctic Research Group at NUPI. Overland completed his PhD at the University of Cambridge and has published extensively on post-Soviet energy issues. He is the co-editor of *Caspian Energy Politics* (Routledge 2010) and *International Arctic Petroleum Cooperation: Barents Sea Scenarios* (Routledge 2015) and co-author of *Financial Sanctions Impact Russian Oil* (Oil & Gas Journal 2015) and *Ranking Oil, Gas and Mining Companies on Indigenous Rights in the Arctic* (Árran 2016).

Nina Poussenkova is Senior Researcher at the Institute of World Economy and International Relations (IMEMO), Russian Academy of Sciences, where she heads the IMEMO Oil and Gas Dialogue Forum, and researcher at the ENERPO Centre of the European University in Saint Petersburg. In the 1990s, she worked at the Centre for Foreign Investment and Privatization and at the investment banks Salomon Brothers and Lazard Freres. From 2006 to 2008, she served as Director of the Energy Programme of the Carnegie Moscow Centre. Poussenkova has also led WWF-Russia projects on Russian companies and corporate citizenship in the twenty-first century and on benchmarking of Russian refineries. She previously taught at the Gubkin State University of Oil and Gas. She is the author of *Russian Oil Companies* (Encyclopaedia of Mineral and Energy Policy, Springer 2016), *The Rosneftization of the Russian Oil Sector* (Oxford Energy Forum 2016) and the co-author of *Arctic Petroleum: Local CSR Perceptions in the Nenets Region of Russia* (Social Responsibility Journal 2017) and *Russia: Public Debate and the Petroleum Sector* (Public Brainpower, Palgrave 2017).
