Michael H. Morris is Professor of Entrepreneurship and Social Innovation at the Keough School of Global Affairs at the University of Notre Dame. Prior to that he held distinguished entrepreneurship chairs at the University of Florida, Oklahoma State University, and Syracuse University. The entrepreneurship programs he has built at different universities have received international recognition. Dr. Morris is a pioneer in curricular innovation and experiential learning. His outreach efforts have facilitated the development of thousands of start-up ventures, and he has launched three ventures of his own. Professor Morris is the Director of the Experiential Classroom, which shares best practices in entrepreneurship education with faculty from around the globe. He also works to bring entrepreneurship empowerment to those operating under conditions of adversity, and annually coordinates the Entrepreneurship Empowerment in South Africa Program. He has authored 13 books and published over 130 articles in peer-reviewed journals. He co-edits the Prentice-Hall Entrepreneurship Series, and is editor emeritus of the *Journal of Developmental Entrepreneurship*. Dr. Morris is a Past President of the United States Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship (USASBE). He has been awarded the Academy of Management's Dedication to Entrepreneurship Award, the Leavey Award from the Freedoms Foundation for impacting private enterprise education, and the Entrepreneurship Educator of the Year Award from USASBE. A former Fulbright Scholar, he earned his PhD in marketing from Virginia Tech in 1983.

Donald F. Kuratko is the Jack M. Gill Distinguished Chair of Entrepreneurship; Professor of Entrepreneurship; Executive and Academic Director, Johnson Center for Entrepreneurship & Innovation, The Kelley School of Business, Indiana University, Bloomington. Dr Kuratko is a prominent scholar and national leader in the field of entrepreneurship, having published over 200 articles on aspects of entrepreneurship and corporate entrepreneurship. Professor Kuratko has authored or co-authored 30 books, including one of the leading entrepreneurship textbooks, *Entrepreneurship: Theory, Process, Practice*, 11th edition

(Cengage Publishers, 2020). In addition, Dr Kuratko has been a consultant on corporate innovation and entrepreneurial strategies to a number of major corporations. Under Professor Kuratko's leadership and with one of the most prolific entrepreneurship faculties in the world, Indiana University's Entrepreneurship Program has consistently been ranked as the #1 university for entrepreneurship research by the Global Entrepreneurship Productivity Rankings; #1 university for Global Entrepreneurship Research in the *Journal of Small Business Management* 12-year analysis for entrepreneurship research productivity, and the #1 Graduate and Undergraduate Business School for Entrepreneurship (Public Institutions) by *U.S. News & World Report*. Professor Kuratko has been named one of the Top 25 Entrepreneurship Scholars in the world and was recipient of the Karl Vesper Entrepreneurship Pioneer Award for his dedication to developing the field of entrepreneurship. He was honored by the National Academy of Management with the Entrepreneurship Mentor Award for his exemplary mentorship to the next generation of entrepreneurship.
