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Viktor A. Venhorst is Assistant Professor in the Faculty of Spatial Sciences at the University of Groningen, the Netherlands. Viktor is also a Research Fellow in the Research Centre for Education and the Labour Market at the University of Maastricht, the Netherlands. His PhD thesis (2007–2011) presents the first study for the Netherlands on the spatial mobility of young recent higher-education graduates. During his post-doc (2011–2014), he extended this research using Statistics Netherlands registry data, applying a longitudinal approach, focusing on issues such as the effects of student entrepreneurship and the longitudinal analysis of regional labour-market dynamics. Other research interests include cross-border commuting, well-being and urban–rural linkages. Together with Dr Gary Bosworth, Viktor is the Winner of the Regional Studies Association Award for Best International Conference Paper Early Career Category 2015, for the paper ‘Economic linkages between urban and rural regions: what’s in it for the rural?’. He was also winner of the Best Referee Award 2013 for the journal *Regional Studies*, and winner of the 2013 Gratama Science Award based on his societally relevant research and outreach activities. Viktor holds a PhD in Spatial Sciences (Cum Laude) and has a background in economics and demography.
