**Bernadette Andreosso-O'Callaghan** holds the Jean Monnet Chair of Economic Integration at the Kemmy Business School of the University of Limerick (UL) (Ireland), and she is also Visiting Professor of East Asian Economics at the Ruhr University Bochum (Germany). She is the co-founder of the Euro-Asia Centre at UL, the first research centre dealing with contemporary Asian Studies in Ireland. She has published extensively in the following areas: comparative Europe-Asia economic integration, and economic growth and structural change in Asian countries, with a focus on East-Asian countries.
